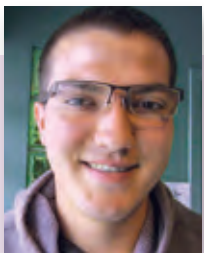

No longer am I sleeping in my car . . . and I am no longer drinking

My name is Michele, and this is my daughter Brinkley. All I can say is MorningStar Mission has saved my life. No longer am I sleeping in my car — and no longer is alcohol ruling my life. But it was a huge part of my life for more than 18 years. When I think of the thousands of dollars I wasted drinking, it makes me feel terrible. My husband was a big drinker, and I just drank to try to keep up with him.

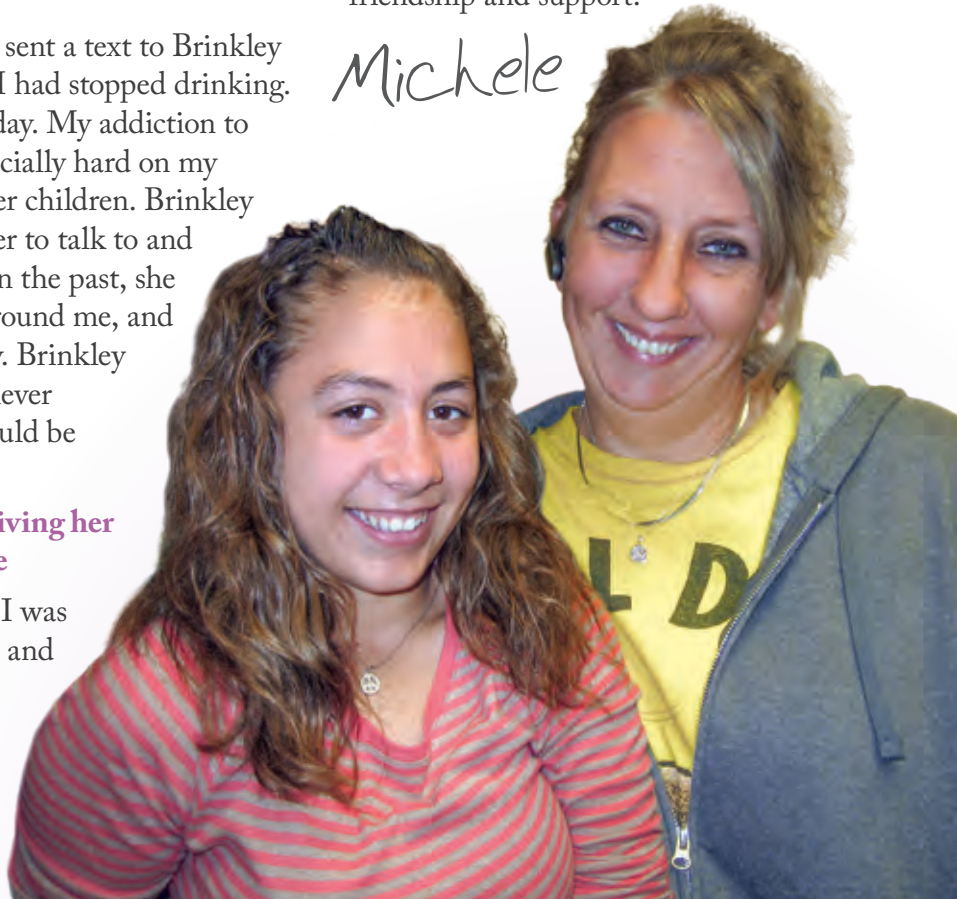
I remember the day I sent a text to Brinkley at school, telling her I had stopped drinking. I'll never forget that day. My addiction to alcohol has been especially hard on my daughter and my other children. Brinkley now tells me I'm easier to talk to and to spend time with. In the past, she never wanted to be around me, and I can understand why. Brinkley would often say she never thought her mom would be sober again.

For so long I felt like I was living in a black hole, and I just kept digging it deeper and deeper. I saw no way of escape. Alcohol was my life and I did not

know how to stop drinking until I came to MorningStar Mission. I'm so grateful to the staff and to you who donate so much of your time and money to keep these doors open for someone like me. Brinkley says she's now giving me another chance. I don't want to disappoint her. But most important, I don't want to disappoint myself. I'm in a good place for now, but I know I have a long way to go. Thank you again for your friendship and support.

My name is James. When I came to the Mission, I thought my problem was drugs and alcohol. But I had a God problem . . . *meaning I refused to have God in my life.* Because of my addiction to marijuana, I lost friends, jobs, property and my self-respect. In the process, I burned all my bridges with those who loved me. I supported my drug habit by stealing, begging, panhandling, bartering, trading and pawning whatever I could get my hands on.

My dad was a police officer for 27 years, and during that time he was a functioning alcoholic. So that's the environment in which I grew up. I had my first drink at 14 years of age. My dad died when I was 16. Now, as I think of him, every day I wish I could be with him and be sober together, and to spend time with him so we could just love each other.

Only now am I assembling the building materials needed to rebuild so many bridges once destroyed. I never thought it would be possible to be sober. But now I know, with God's help, I have the opportunity to become accountable for my actions and once again be a responsible citizen. I want that more than anything. A thousand thank-yous are not enough. You are helping me turn my life around, just as you are reaching out to so many others. I will be eternally grateful to you. God bless you at this Easter season.

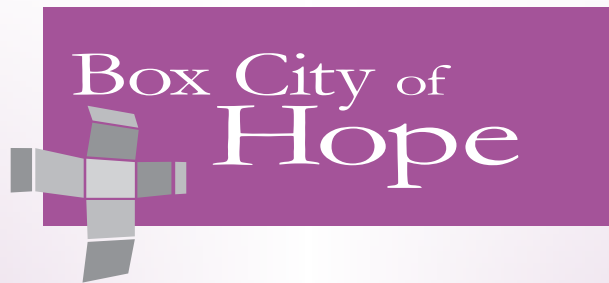
