Because of my poor judgment, I became homeless, I panhandled for money, and I stared down the barrel of a gun at a stop sign where a guy said, "Hey, man, go get a job." I even used to hang out in front of strip clubs so I could gather up the loose change falling from the pockets of drunks leaving the clubs. Not much of a life, was it?
