You Helped Carl Find New Life

was the saddest person in the world," Carl says. "So, coming to MorningStar Mission has been a godsend."

Carl has battled depression nearly half of his life, and in recent years, that was made worse by a chemical addiction. At his lowest, he was homeless and living out of a car. That's when a friend took him to a local church to see if they could help, and they referred him to the Mission.

Our staff enrolled Carl in our 180 men's residential recovery program, and God immediately began a new work in him. In addition to overcoming his addiction, Carl is rebuilding his relationship with God. "I didn't study the Bible before," he says. "But now it's something I look forward to every day, because it's helped me so much."

Now sober for eight months, Carl is also repairing relationships with his four grown children and felt a huge breakthrough recently when his daughter took the initiative to reach out to him. "I've never been happier in my life," he says.

Helping others find new life is what the Mission is all about, and Carl is a testament to that. "I have a new life here," he says. "My self-esteem and confidence are getting better and better, and I finally like myself. I finally have peace."


