# Giving Families Stars of Hope

Your support gives families in need the chance to celebrate the holidays.

Imagine a child on Christmas morning, waking up to no presents under the tree. No Christmas dinner to look forward to. The thought is heartbreaking.

Fortunately, families who are struggling this holiday season will have something to celebrate thanks to your support of programs at MorningStar Mission, such as providing holiday meals and the Stars of Hope program — a program that ensures children from low-income families receive presents to open on Christmas morning.

Qualified families can register at MorningStar to receive food baskets for Thanksgiving and Christmas dinner, and to participate in Stars of Hope.

With Stars of Hope, parents or guardians of children and teens 17 years old or younger can fill out a form with gift suggestions for their children. The list includes things they need and things they want just for fun. Each child's wish list becomes a star that donors can choose to adopt. They purchase items from the star and drop them off here at the Mission. Then,

families pick up the gifts and get them ready for Christmas morning. It's that simple!

Because of you, children will have presents to open on Christmas morning. Families will be able to share holiday meals together on Thanksgiving and Christmas. They'll have even more to look forward to at the holidays.

*Thank you for thinking of families who are struggling this holiday season. Your support means the world to the people you're helping.*

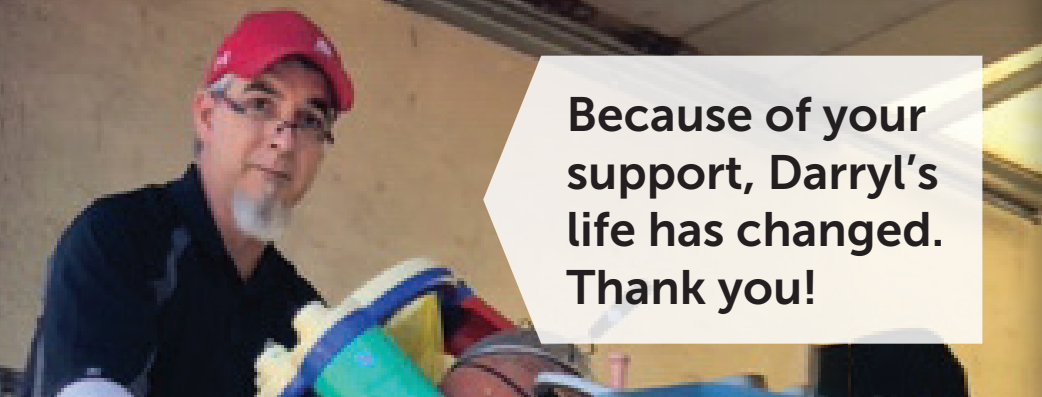


## ★ ★ ★ STARS OF HOPE GUIDELINES ★ ★ ★

***If you would like to adopt a star from the Stars of Hope program, please read the guidelines below.***

- ★ Individuals are assigned a letter and number. Please make sure all gifts are labeled with this letter/number combination.
- ★ Clothing gifts should be appropriate to the sizes listed on the form.
- ★ Wish lists are shopping suggestions. Just because an item is on the wish list does not mean it must be purchased.
- ★ Gift cards will not be accepted as gifts.
- ★ Do not include receipts with gifts. (This is to prevent recipients from taking them back to the store to get a refund.)
- ★ While the amount of money spent by the donor is the donor's discretion, a suggested gift amount is \$40 for clothing and \$40 for wish items.
- ★ Gift wrapping is encouraged.
- ★ All gifts MUST be tagged with the star securely attached and visible on the outside of the package.
- ★ If there is more than one package for the same person, please bundle them together in a large, sturdy, plastic garbage bag and clearly mark on all packages the complete number and letter for each individual.

"I Can Walk With My Head High"

Darryl still remembers how it felt when his mother, an alcoholic, walked out on the family when he was just 6 years old. And it wouldn't be the last time alcohol would tear his family apart.

Years later, it cost Darryl his marriage. "We separated because of her drinking," he says. "I'd asked her for years to quit, and she wouldn't, so I finally left."

Not long after his marriage ended, Darryl turned to the bottle himself. Because of his drinking, Darryl nearly lost his relationship with his daughter. After his daughter and her mother left their home in Seattle, Darryl tried to repair the relationship by following them to Illinois. But he wasn't able to stop drinking.

That's when he turned to MorningStar Mission for help. "I knew it was time to change my life and become a better person. I want to be there for my daughter," Darryl says.

Thanks to friends like you, Darryl has the tools and support he needs to maintain his sobriety and repair his relationship with his daughter.

"When I walked in, my head was hung low, and I was broken and miserable. I felt ashamed," he says. "Now, I can walk with my head high. I'm proud of what I've achieved. I don't feel broken."
