"I had to change."

How you helped this lost father become his daughter's "favorite person in the whole world."

B ill said goodbye to his family and left his home in Kentucky when he was 18. He had \$100 in his pocket, most of which went for a bus ticket to Illinois. With just \$25 and a solid work ethic to his credit, he carved out a future for himself. He got a job, married and had two children. He seemed to be on a good, straight path.

But somewhere along the line, that path turned into a roller coaster. The devoted husband and father fell victim to substance abuse and everything else took a back seat. "I lost myself," Bill admits. He turned to crime to support his addiction and ended up in jail. It was the best thing that could have happened to him.

While Bill was incarcerated, his public defender proposed he go for help to MorningStar Mission as an alternative to prison. Not knowing what to expect, Bill was anxious, but he approached the opportunity with his whole heart. "I didn't want to go back into society that same person I was. I had to change. And that's what I did."

Bill admits it wasn't easy at first. It was tough to accept constructive criticism and advice. But as time went on, he committed himself to the program and allowed God to work in his life. "All I had to do was get out of my own way," he says.

Today, Bill is about halfway through the program — and he sees a bright future at the end of it. "God has put it on my heart to help people," he tells us.

"I want to lead by example and show other people they can do this too. They can give everything up for something better."

In the meantime, Bill has two enthusiastic supporters: his teenage daughter and son. "They see that I'm doing things for the right reasons, to become a better person. My daughter tells me I'm her favorite person in the whole world."

Bill also has a caring supporter in you — and he understands the impact of your giving. "For some here, this might be their last opportunity," he says. "If you change just that one life, the effects could echo around the world."
